| Des Plaines, IL<br>Cook County<br>Population: 58,364 | <a href="#">Section 4-4-1</a><br>Premises restrictions.<br>Common language included for retailers near churches, schools, hospitals, etc.  |
| Berwyn, IL<br>Cook County<br>Population: 56,657      | <a href="#">Part 8-Title 2-Chapter 804.16</a><br>Common language included to restrict licenses from businesses where majority of customers are minors or sales are school books or supplies, food, lunches or drinks for minors.               |
| Chicago, IL<br>Cook County<br>Population: 2,716,450  | <a href="#">Section 4-60-021</a><br>Language that allows the city council to prohibit the issuance of additional liquor licenses in a specified area of the city, subject to conditions and procedures.  |
| Wilmington, IL<br>Will County<br>Population: 5,724   | <a href="#">Section 112.25</a><br>Number of liquor licenses authorized. Chart showing classifications and maximum number of licenses authorized.   |
| Glenview, IL<br>Cook County<br>Population: 47,475    | <a href="#">Section 6-24</a><br>Total number of liquor licenses issued chart with additional language allowing the Board of Trustees to reduce the maximum number of licenses if a license lapses, is revoked, or is terminated in any manner. |

| Volo, IL<br>Lake County<br>Population: 2,929                                  | <a href="#">Section 4-2-12</a><br>Chart with license class and maximum number of licenses. Language included that without further action of the Village Board, the maximum number of licenses in any class shall be automatically reduced by one upon expiration, revocation, or non-renewal of an existing license in any such license class. |
| Brookfield, IL<br>Cook County<br>Population: 18,978                           | <a href="#">Section 6-181</a><br>Related to alcohol outlet density and retailer location, language is provided on deleterious impact complaint process.  |
| East Peoria, IL<br>Tazewell County<br>Population: 23,402                      | <a href="#">Section 3-3-4.23</a><br>Language included on how to calculate distance measurement between a licensed building in which alcohol is served and church, school, hospital, etc.   |
| Eureka, IL<br>Woodford County<br>Population: 5,295                            | <a href="#">Section 6-51</a><br>Language provided for limitation on number of licenses. Includes language as to why the limitations are in place.  |
| Aurora, IL<br>DuPage, Kane, Kendall, and Will Counties<br>Population: 197,899 | <a href="#">Section 6-14</a><br>Related to alcohol outlet density, language included for drive-through services prohibited.  |
| Springfield, IL<br>Sangamon County<br>Population: 116,250                     | <a href="#">Section 90.17</a><br>Language allowing city council to set a limitation on the number of licenses for each classification of license.  |
