Every achievement showcases the passion and dedication of our staff, the trust and partnership of our funders, and the unwavering support of our community collaborators and stakeholders.

In FY25, Prevention First continued to expand its impact across Illinois through high-quality training, informational resources, and technical assistance focused on addressing substance use, violence, and suicide. This year, we were selected as Illinois' statewide Opioid and Trauma Training and Assistance Center (OTTAC) provider, marking a significant expansion of our leadership in prevention and public health. This milestone positions our organization at the forefront of strengthening the state's capacity to address opioid use disorder, trauma-informed care, prevention workforce development, and culturally responsive practices.

A major highlight of the year was launching our first Connections in Prevention Annual Conference.

which brought together professionals working in substance misuse, violence prevention, suicide prevention, mental health advocacy, and related fields. The conference provided a lively and engaging platform for over 200 prevention professionals to collaborate, learn, and share best practices through keynote speeches, workshops, and networking opportunities.

ADVOCATE - We take an active role in addressing prevention areas of need through public awareness campaigns, resource centers, special initiatives, conferences, and networking events.




From peer pressure to job stressors, from the classroom to the corner office, the stakes have never been

From developing comprehensive media campaigns to maintaining resource libraries and distributing timely information through our newsletters and social media, we ensure that every prevention professional has access to high-quality, evidence-based materials.
