

SAC QUICKtips: EFFECTIVE PROBLEM-SOLVING AND ACTION-PLANNING

- 1. Regard intervention as a series of smaller steps rather than one action.
- 2. View individual student interventions as short term in nature.
- 3. Consider the unique needs of each student when designing interventions.
- 4. Set a goal for each intervention regardless of how small the intervention seems to be.
- 5. Identify who will be responsible for what actions.
- 6. Connect students and families with community professional support when needed rather than try to provide therapy when unqualified.
- 7. Create concrete steps that are immediate in nature and 'doable' be the student.
- 8. Get the student's input on intervention steps.
- 9. Define the expected outcome and identify progress indicators.
- 10. Place responsibility for change with the student when the intervention is directed to the student.
- 11. Avoid enabling inappropriate behaviors.
- 12. Assist students in troubleshooting breakdowns in intervention steps helping the student to develop problem-solving strategies for meeting intervention goals in the future.
- 13. Conduct progress monitoring as planned, and communicate frequently with the student and others involved with the SAP as needed.
