The Illinois Youth Survey is a highly valuable resource that provides insight into the availability of alcoholic beverages to persons under the age of 21 in particular areas of the State. That data will allow the ILCC and other law enforcement agencies to better identify potential problem areas and to allocate resources where they are needed most

DID YOU KNOW?

The Illinois Youth Survey may have data from your area on...

- driving under the influence
- how youth access alcohol at a retail level
- use of curbside and home delivery
- where youth are accessing alcohol and other substances

WHAT IS THE IYS?

IYS is a voluntary survey conducted every 2 years with 8th, 10th, and 12th graders in Illinois. School results are returned only to individual schools, but if the schools in your area already participate in the survey, there may also be publicly available data. If your area schools do not participate, encourage them to take it.

WHAT'S IN IT FOR YOU?

- Having local data can make your jobs easier and can help bring in funding.
- Reinforces the need for alcohol enforcement details like Alcohol **Compliance Checks.**
- Policies implemented based on data have a positive ripple effect. Studies have proven that a more limited access to alcohol reduces violence and prevents suicides.
